

Leadership Evolution at Rollstone Church

ay back when the pandemic was just getting started it became apparent that to help the church get through the shutdown forced by the Covid Virus we would need a different approach to the church's leadership. That spring I started a "Leadership Team" consisting of the chairs of the Deacons, Trustees & Board of Ed as well as the Treasurer, Facilities Chair, Clerk, Asst Moderator & Pastor. This group met monthly on Zoom and coordinated all the activities of the church. Although it wasn't an "official" body for church leaders it allowed us to keep all the important activities of the church functioning and I believe it was instrumental in helping the church survive during the isolation caused by the pandemic.

With the acceptance of the new by-laws for Rollstone we will be continuing this organization, adding a representative

of the congregation and a representative from the Church and Pastoral Relations Committee, as the Church Council. This group allows all aspects of the church to be coordinated through a single group who will be responsible to bring information & ideas to and from their respective committees.

For the next several months we will be in a transition period as we learn how to optimize this leadership model. I expect that through the winter months we will continue to meet on ZOOM monthly. We look forward to your participation and feedback as we bring Rollstone back into the main steam of our community.

A Final Report from the By-Law Review Committee

Then the congregation voted to ratify the by-law proposal from the By-Law Review Committee, we all breathed a sigh of relief because our work was now done. At that point the committee was dissolved, and the outstanding tasks were turned over to the new Church Council for implementation. We want to thank each member of the congregation who offered us support and brought forth many thoughts for us to consider, which did cause us to rethink portions and amendments were then brought forth.

The newly revised by-laws are being sent to church council for a final review and a notary stamp to indicate that they have been scrutinized to verify that we have not done anything that violates any general law or statute of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Once the stamped copy is back in our possession, we will begin to distribute the latest By-Laws of Rollstone Congregational Church, Revision 2.0, dated October 17, 2021. We are asking that each member only take one copy of the by-laws, and if

a couple could limit themselves to one copy that would be great.

Expect the copies to be available at the start of December at fellowship hour, copies not picked up prior to Dec. 31st will be mailed.

Thank you and blessings as we enter a new era in the life of Rollstone Congregational.

November 24 – "Community Makes God Visible" based on Psalm 133 and Hebrews 13:1-6


December 1 – "Worth Waiting For" based on Ephesians 1:3-14

The week of October 17-23 was a busy one for work being done in and around our Church Building. A new shed was being constructed, a new bulkhead installed, a new light installed in the parking lot light, and classrooms got cleaned.

A new Bulkhead Doorway to the Church Basement has been installed on the Snow St. side of the building. The old plywood bulkhead has been replaced with a new steel bulkhead. The Stewardship theme for the United Church of Christ this year grew out of theme from General Synod this past July. As we prepare for a new budget and a new year we want you to reflect upon yielding a bountiful harvest and how we can achieve that.

We ask that you prayerfully consider how you will be a part of Rollstone Congregational's resurgance in the Fitchburg area. Will you be able to help with programs through the various avenues of contributing? Will you be able to offer assistance in any of the three T's – Time – Treasure – Talents?

How can I support the church in its vision for the future? The support of many makes the load lighter for everyone, will you consider in helping however you are best able?




