reetings as we begin our Lenten journey rtowards Easter. It is hard to believe that we are starting to focus upon Lent and Easter as the memories of the Christmas season begins to fade away into a distant memory.

In these days of preparation and meditation we are being called to focus on the ministry and mission of Jesus Christ. This season can be enriching and life altering as we strive to envision how God plans to use us as instruments of His grace and peace. We have devotionals for everyone to help you in the journey and a Lenten Daily Scripture calendar. We will make them available at church (as the mailing costs are astronomical) for distribution. On the printed edition of the Rolling Stone, we will include them for your use and enjoyment. We are still working with Gavin Klein to see what his availability will be to support us during the Lenten season and Holy Week. We invite you to join with us as we engage each other in this journey.

Church School Message and News - March 2022



In this scripture, MATTHEW 4:18-22, Jesus calls his first disciples. He doesn't call them to be preachers or teachers. He calls them to do something they know about. Jesus tells Peter, Andrew, James, and John that he wants them

to be fishers of men. That sounds strange, but they were all actually fishermen, and Jesus was speaking their language.

Fishermen go out to sea to gather up fish. They use lures and bait to draw the fish in so that they can be caught. As Christians we don't try to catch people, but we do want to catch their attention and tell them about Jesus. We can't dangle worms in front of them like fishermen! We need bait that will help people see how much Jesus loves them.

The best way to draw people to Jesus is by loving others the way Jesus first loved us! We can love others by being a good friend, being helpful, and being a good listener. It also means reaching out to people who don't have many friends.

Loving others also means we resist the temptation to hurt others. When someone pushes us, we don't push back. When people gossip, we don't join in. When we are called names we can respond with love instead of cruel words. People may think we are strange for doing such things. Anyone else would fight back! But we are not "anyone else." We are fishers of men. Ask God to make you a fisher of men. Ask him to help you share His love with others.

Dear God, Thank you for the people who taught us about Jesus. Use us to share His love with others. In Jesus' name, Amen



Unscramble these Jumbles, one letter to each square, to form four ordinary words.







Hymn Story "Nearer, My God, to Thee"

arah Flower Adams (1805-1848) was a British actress who received praise for her performances on the stage. After health problems disrupted her plans to continue with theater, she found comfort in writing poems and hymns.

Her most notable hymn, "Nearer, My God, to Thee," was written in 1841. Adams based the hymn on the story of "Jacob's Ladder" as told in Genesis 28:11-17. In Jacob's dream he saw angels ascending a ladder into heaven and he named the place of his vision, "Bethel, the House of God." The hymn was originally set to music written by Adam's sister, Eliza Flower, but another hymn tune called "Bethany," written by Lowell Mason in 1856, has become the tune we now most associate with this hymn. Lowell Mason was a leading composer of American sacred music, and was awarded the first degree of Doctor of Music ever given in America.

Few hymns have such a number of associations surrounding its use. It was the favorite hymn of President William McKinley, and brought him peace and comfort in his last hours. The hymn has been featured in many shows and movies. Perhaps the most famous is the 1997 movie "Titanic," in a scene that is said to mirror the actual event of the ship's band playing "Nearer, My God, to Thee," while the Titanic was sinking. As we sing the hymn we find the message that even in darkness and trouble may we be lifted nearer to God.

Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer to Thee, Even though it be a cross that raiseth me; Still all my song shall be, Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer to Thee.

Then with my waking thoughts bright with Thy praise, Out of my stony griefs Bethel I'll raise; So by my woes to be Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer, my God, to Thee, nearer to Thee.

Or if on joyful wing, cleaving the sky, Sun, moon, and stars forgot, upward I fly, Still all my song shall be, Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer, my God, to Thee, nearer to Thee.


In a recent announcement from Rollstone Congregational Church, the church dinners will be returning in March of 2022.
